Applicable Laws and Rules

• Federal and state law prohibits discrimination and harassment based on a "protected characteristic," including:

• Age

• Disability

• Gender

• Gender identity/expression

• National origin

• Pregnancy

• Race

• Religion

• Sex

• Sexual orientation

• ACGME requires policies that allow report and resolution of harassment

Harassment Basics

Sexual harassment includes:

''Quid pro quo" harassment

Unwelcome conduct on the basis of sex so "severe, persistent or pervasive" that it unreasonably interferes in training/work


Includes forms of sexual violence

Other forms of harassment include verbal, graphic or physical conduct that demonstrates hostility or aversion to an individual based on a protected characteristic when it creates a hostile environment or unreasonably interferes with their performance.


